Why mutation matters

Mutation updates revenue records to reflect a change in ownership or possession after sale, gift, succession or court decree. It does not by itself create title, but incomplete mutation often causes later disputes, loan issues or tax problems.

Before you apply

Gather registered documents, identity proofs, prior pattadar or title records, and any court orders. Check for prior claims, attachments or inconsistencies in survey numbers before filing.

Questions to organise

Prepare the transaction or succession timeline, the documents available, the names and survey details shown in each record, and any objection, notice or prior application.

PRACTICAL NEXT STEP

Bring your timeline, questions and relevant documents to a focused conversation. Do not upload confidential documents unless the firm specifically asks you to do so.
